Jesus effectively used parables and metaphors rooted in the local culture—such as theater, royal courts, and political conflicts—to make his spiritual teachings relatable and impactful.

- Context: The discussion explains how Jesus’s teachings were not abstract but were deeply connected to the everyday reality of his audience, leveraging familiar events and cultural norms as powerful teaching tools.
- Key Insight: Jesus’s criticism of the Pharisees as ‘hypocrites’ was a direct reference to stage actors who wore masks and were announced with trumpets, a metaphor his audience would have instantly understood.
- Key Insight: Parables about kings, noblemen, and servants (e.g., Luke 19, Matthew 22) were effective because they drew upon common knowledge of royal and economic life.
- Key Insight: Specific historical events, like Herod Philip’s politically costly divorce and subsequent war, were used as contemporary examples for teachings, such as the need to ‘count the cost’ before acting (Luke 14).
